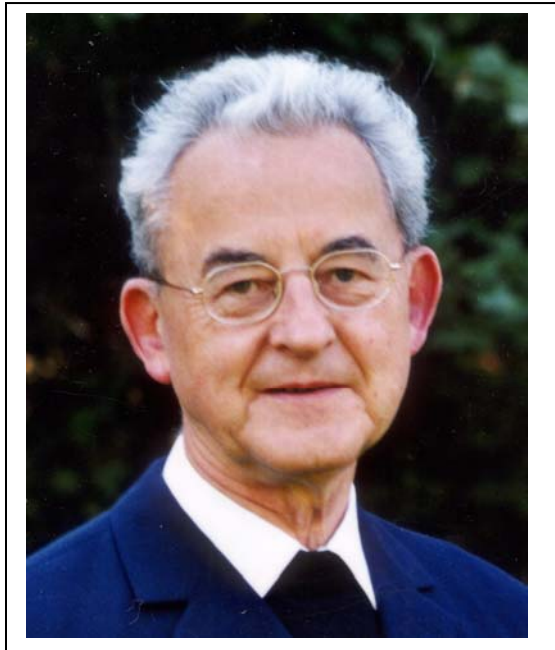


## Prof. Dr. Karl-Heinz Peschke, SVD



- 1932 Born in Breslau (Wrocław), Silesia
- 1951 Graduation diploma of senior high school (Abitur) in Osnabrück and entrance in the Society of the Divine Word (SVD) in St. Augustin near Bonn.
- 1958 Ordination to the priesthood in St. Augustin
- 1959 Licentiate in theology at the University Gregoriana, Rome
- 1959 - 1962 Lecturer of moral theology at the seminaries of the Divine Word Missionaries in São Paulo, Brazil, and in Sankt Augustin, Germany
- 1965 Doctorate in moral theology at the Academia Alfonsiana in Rome
- 1968 - 1984 Professor of moral theology at the Divine Seminary in Tagaytay City, Philippines
- 1984 - 1991 Professor at the Pontifical University Urbaniana, Rome
- 1991 - 2000 Professor at the Theological Faculty St. Gabriel, Mödling near Vienna
- 1995 - 2003 Professor at the Philosophical-Theological Faculty St. Augustin, Sankt Augustin near Bonn
- 1999 - 2007 Professor at the Philosophical-Theological Faculty Benedict XVI, Heiligenkreuz im Wienerwald, Austria

Prof. Karl H. Peschke (abbreviation of name used in English publications) is best known for his two volumes of moral theology, *Christian Ethics*, which went through several editions and have been translated in various languages, among them Korean, German, Chinese and Indonesian.
